Wednesday Sessions 10:45 - 12:15

Managing Properties with Multiple Funding Sources –

It takes a village (of funders) to create affordable housing and it isn't easy keeping all of their different regulations straight. Learn more about how LIHTC, HOME, CDBG and Housing Choice Voucher rules overlap and about strategies for staying in compliance. (HM)

Housing IS Healthcare – Housing instability and poor health are cyclical - the cause and effect are interchangeable. This session looks at the ties between housing instability and health, and identifies promising strategies that communities may use to end homelessness, improve the health of their communities, and promote the health of all our residents. (HCV)

What is a Continuum of Care (CoC) and Why Does it Matter to PHAs – Hear from experts from across the state about how the spectrum of homelessness services and funding is delivered in Colorado. Hear ways to leverage CoC and PHA resources to be mutually beneficial for the agencies and to help people struggling with housing instability. (HO)

Preparing for a REAC Inspection – This session will review how to prepare for a REAC inspection. It will cover the areas that will be inspected, preparations for long term and short term, understanding scoring, what to do on inspection day, where an inspector looks, defect levels, top 10 defects, non-industry standard repair and photo review of defects. (PBS8)

Adaptive Reuse & Historic Preservation – Hartman Ely Investments and Metro West Housing Solutions will discuss several of their unique and award-winning projects. Learn about the creative financing and use of space, as well as the unexpected twists and turns of working within historic constraints and old buildings. (CD)

Finding Alternative Responses to Conflict – Conflict is a reality in many aspects of life. This engaging session will help develop your communication skills and resilience. (PD)

Developing Written Policies – A Workshop for Commissioners and Executive Directors – This session is a working session in how to team effectively with the executive director to develop policy documents. Participants are encouraged to bring sample documents. We will focus on the development and oversight of an Ethics Policy with steps that can be replicated. (CM)

Wednesday Sessions 2:00 - 3:30

Resilient Property Management for the Next 50 Years –

Climate Change has already come to Colorado. Over the next 50 years, our region will see more forest fires, intense rainfall events, and increasing demands on limited water rights and an aging power grid. Learn how your property can best adapt, protect residents, and reduce operating costs in the face of these changes. (HM)

HUD: HCV and Public Housing Updates – In this session, staff from the Regional HUD office will present on recent policy changes and HUD Hot Topics for both HCV and Public Housing programs. (HCV, HM)

What Can We Do to Help People Experiencing

Homelessness – Learn about the spectrum of services available for people experiencing homelessness including emergency options like shelter to long-term housing programs like Rapid Re-Housing. Hear more about what gaps there are in this system in certain communities and how PHAs can access limited resources for those in need. (HO)

Fair Housing for People with Disabilities: Ensuring Equal Housing Access – Learn from HUD's Office of Fair Housing and Equal Opportunity about your obligations and responsibilities with respect to ensuring equal housing access for people with disabilities, including the A-Z of reasonable accommodations/modifications with a heavy focus on assistance animals, Section 504 affirmative obligations for HUD program participants, and an overview of the Fair Housing Act and Section 504 physical accessibility requirements. (PBS8, HCV, HM)

Lead-Based Paint – This session will provide a brief overview and guidance for successful evaluation and control of lead-based paint hazards. (CD)

Vicarious & Secondary Trauma: Understanding the Impact of Trauma on You and Your Clients – This session will provide an overview of vicarious & secondary trauma and offer solutions on how an agency can support clients dealing with trauma. This session will also cover the trauma experienced by those working in the agency, the importance of self-care, and resources for both clients and providers. (PD)

Building in the Mountains without LIHTC – This session will cover creative approaches to meeting local housing needs using other funding sources, including affordable homeownership, rental, and housing for seniors. (HD)

Wednesday Sessions 3:45 - 5:15

Maximizing Utilization of Accessible Units – Learn about the demand for accessible units in Colorado, Section 504 requirements to maximize occupancy of accessible units by people who need them, and marketing strategies and tools for matching people with disabilities to accessible units. (HM)



Colorado Choice Transitions (CCT) Program – In this session, two state agencies (DOH and HCPF) will present on CCT, a program designed to assist Health First Colorado (Colorado's Medicaid Program) members who are interested in transitioning out of long-term care facilities back into home and community-based settings. (HCV)

Where's the Money? – Hear from national and local leaders in the homelessness and housing advocacy arena on what federal dollars are available and how they flow to organizations, public housing authorities, and individuals. Learn about changes in funding streams over the years and how Colorado has been impacted. (HO)

ABC's of LIHTC – People who are new to the tax credit world can often be overwhelmed by all the information and regulations. The class is targeted to onsite staff at existing LIHTC properties or those properties that have recently been awarded tax credits. (PBS8)

Opportunity Zones – The Tax Cuts and Jobs Act created Opportunity Zones, a new community investment tool designed to drive capital to rural and low-income urban areas. This session will provide an overview and discuss ideas for local policies and programs to attract and maximize investments within Opportunity Zones. (CD)

Wellness at Work – Attendees of this session will learn the many benefits of incorporating wellness into the workplace. The session will also introduce the basics of mindfulness at work and its positive impact on stress and productivity. The speakers will discuss real-world examples of the impact of incorporating wellness into the workplace and mindfulness exercise to immediately incorporate into your day. (PD)

Uncovering Hidden Land Opportunities – With land costs increasing throughout the Denver Metro Area, creative solutions are needed to make deals work in an increasingly difficult housing development environment. Come learn how to partner with local jurisdictions, faith-based communities, and other organizations to utilize vacant land for affordable housing projects. (HD)

Creative Solutions to Affordable Housing Preservation – Come learn about creative ways local governments and housing authorities are keeping affordable housing in their communities by embracing mobile home parks, partnering with community land trusts, and implementing local preservation policies. (HM, RH)

Customer Service and the Citizen Experience – Staff from the HUD Office of the Regional Administrator (Region VIII) present on how housing agencies can continue to improve the customer service we provide to our housing participants. (HCV, HM)

Evicting with Dignity and Respect – The eviction process is never easy – it takes a toll on tenants and landlords but it doesn't have to be all bad. Learn from Colorado Coalition for the Homeless Property Management Staff about a new framework for helping clients and residents navigate housing systems and resources to avoid evictions when possible and resolve landlord and tenant disputes. (HO, HCV, HM)

How to Make the Most of Your Contract Renewal – Come meet with Multifamily HUD representatives to learn the ins and outs of contracts and discover the best options for your property that makes the most financial sense. This session also includes updates on other Multifamily programs and policies. (PBS8)

Zero Energy Homes – Can zero energy housing really be built affordably? Join industry experts to discuss new concepts in efficiency standards and energy ready homes. (CD)

Workforce Trends, Wellness, and Retention – Our employees are investing in us just as we invest in them. Savvy employees know if you are standing by your word in the employment relationship. What are you doing to earn their trust and commitment? What is meaningful to employees today? (PD)

Service-Enriched Housing: Lessons in Implementing Health & Education Initiative – Representatives from four housing authorities that are actively working on planning and implementation for education and health programs will share their progress and their lessons learned. The session will be a blend of best-practice sharing and strategic planning. (RS)

Permanent Supportive Housing Overview and Property Management – PSH is decent, safe, affordable, community-based housing that provides tenants with all the rights and responsibilities of tenancy and links to intensive supportive services. Learn about the Denver Social Impact Bond program as public-private housing partnership to address chronic homelessness. Also learn about development and property management considerations specific to building and managing PSH. (HM, HO)

Co-Responder Program – The Co-Responder program is a joint project between Mental Health Center of Denver and the Denver Police Department to provide a response to persons in the community in crisis or in need of appropriate interventions. (HCV, RS)

Protecting Tenants Through Legislative Efforts – Colorado has some of the fewest renters' protections laws in the country. Hear from statewide advocates who have been working at local and state levels to remedy that and provide better legal protections for tenants in Colorado. (HO, HCV, HM)

EIV Fundamentals – In this session we will look at key requirements for Multifamily EIV. We will discuss required policy and procedures, EIV reports and how to address discrepancies. (PBS8)

Expanding Economic Mobility – Learn about projects that enhance the economic mobility of residents and communities. Topics include housing programs such as accessory dwelling units, education and career services, and more. (CD)

Continuous Quality Improvement 101 for Housing Professionals – Continuous Quality Improvement, Quality Improvement, LEAN, Six Sigma, Process Improvement – what does it all mean and how can it help our agency and community achieve better outcomes? Attend this interactive session to receive a crash course on CQI basics and how, as a housing professional, you can use CQI components to improve service delivery and agency outcomes. (PD)

Risk Management: Expect the Unexpected – PHAs face a variety of risks ranging from property damages to employment practices claims. Learn from industry experts how to prepare yourself for the most common, and unexpected, events. (FI)

The Colorado NAHRO *Yes! In My Back Yard Awards* give recognition to the outstanding places, people, and programs affiliated with NAHRO agency members. The awards recognize best practices among housing, redevelopment, and community agencies and provide a resource bank of information for NAHRO members. Applications will be reviewed by a panel of housing professionals. The selection criteria will include innovation, agency role, results, cost, financing, and general opinion. One winner will be selected from each of the following categories, which coincide with the conference's program tracks:

1. Community Development
2. Commissioners
3. Finance
4. Housing Choice Voucher
5. Housing Development
6. Housing Management/Public Housing
7. Homelessness
8. Project-Based Section 8
9. Professional Development
10. Rehab
11. Resident Services

Places, people, or programs are eligible to receive an award in any one category chosen from above. Entries will be reviewed in light of the following selection criteria:

- Impact on the community by adding to the affordable housing stock or improving the immediate social or economic fabric;
- Role in overall community revitalization or social change;
- Sets a new standard or pioneers a new method (taps new funding sources; demonstrates new efficiency in capital costs and/or maintenance/operating costs, etc.);
- Employs cost-effective or innovative design and/or construction, including energy efficiency and sustainable development;
- Offers outstanding social services for tenants;
- Received broad community support, including state and local government financial assistance;
- Addresses a unique challenge;
- Demonstrates creative problem-solving; and
- Evidence of cost-effectiveness, i.e., producing housing at substantially below-market rents or home prices, at a reasonable subsidy per unit.

YIMBY Awards - Eligibility

- Entry must have been put into place after January 1, 2018.
- The entry must not have previously received a Colorado NAHRO award.
- Entry can be in only one category.

YIMBY Awards - Application

- Complete an entry form and scan it as the first page of a pdf file.
- The entry must be submitted electronically as a single pdf file, and should be no more than 5 pages in length, including all photos and other materials.
- Applications should concisely respond to as many of the items listed in the selection criteria in above as appropriate.
